Getting to college

We know that travel can be a big deciding factor in which college a student chooses, so we want to make sure that it's the last thing you have to worry about.

We offer help with the cost of travelling to college with bursaries and support funds – eligibility is subject to individual circumstances. If you need help paying for travel, contact us or visit our website for more information.

Traineeships

Traineeships are designed to help young people aged 16-24 who want to get an apprenticeship or job but don't yet have appropriate skills or experience. Tailored specifically to your individual needs, they allow you to complete a work placement for up to six months in a job of your choice, while getting support to improve English and maths skills where needed. When you finish you'll leave with a reference from your employer. Traineeships can often lead to a paid apprenticeship too.

Apprenticeships

An apprenticeship is a job that allows you to earn money in your chosen sector, while studying to gain industry-recognised qualifications that will help you to progress in your career. Any person over 16 who is in employment can apply to become an apprentice. Here at Totton College, we will help students find the right apprenticeship for them and provide support throughout, ensuring that both the employer and student make the most of the programme.

Study programme

Every student that comes to Totton College will have a study programme which includes:

Qualification + **English** and/or **Maths** + **Work**

If you do not get a C or above in GCSE Maths and English, you will retake one or both of these alongside your study, or be working towards this through Functional Skills Maths or English.
